


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FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

This case was related to prostatic surgery. We received a prostate biopsy specimen for histopathology. The clinical diagnosis was Prostatic carcinoma with invasion. Radiology report was also correlating with the clinical diagnosis. The surgeon wanted a histopathology report before deciding on major surgery including orchidectomy. My histopathology findings were just opposite, it was a benign lesion- Benign prostatic hyperplasia. It was very difficult for the surgeons to accept this diagnosis so I asked them to give me another biopsy sample. They complied , and did another biopsy and I repeated the histopathology process on the fresh sample. It was again BPH. So orchidectomy was not done. To everyone's relief, the final HPE report was also Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia. This is how a good lab and good interdepartmental communication can benefit both the patient and the doctors.

A CASE WITH A DIFFERENCE


An interesting case of fever

A 33 year old male came to us with the complaints of fever and weight loss since last 2 months and cough with yellow sputum since last 2 weeks prior to presentation. There was also history of 2 units PRBC transfusion about a month ago and also of being on some iv antibiotic regime. No records were available. He had a CBC report prior to this treatment- Haemoglobin 8.4, TLC 18900 (N70, L22, M6, E2), Platelet count 42,000. On examination, apart from fever and Pallor, there were no other signs. After sending routine investigations and relevant cultures, he was started on broad spectrum antibiotics. Relevant investigations: LDH more than 1000, Ferritin more than 7000, USG s/o Splenic abscesses (2). CBC- Hb 7.81, MCV 103, TLC 12510, N40, L22, M10, E0, B0, Platelet Count-40000/mm3. Peripheral smear showed Metamyelocyte 1, Myelocytes 8, Atypical Cells 19 and Auer rods.

Auer rods (or Auer bodies) are large, crystalline cytoplasmic inclusion bodies sometimes observed in myeloid blast cells during acute myeloid leukemia, acute promyelocytic leukemia, high-grade myelodysplastic syndromes and myeloproliferative disorders. Composed of fused lysosomes and rich in lysosomal enzymes, Auer rods are azurophilic and can resemble needles, commas, diamonds, rectangles, corkscrews, or (rarely) granules. Thus by keen observation of our pathologist Dr Renu Aggarwal, the diagnosis was narrowed down to a haematological malignancy ?AML



MY PMC JOURNEY

For this issue of the 'Connect," I have done a one-on-one interview with Dr. Rajesh Dhall, the invisible face behind most surgeries at PMC, our extremely competent but exceedingly modest, HOD Department of Anesthesia and Critical Care.

Dr. Dhall is an alumnus of Maulana Azad Medical College, Delhi. He completed MD Anesthesia in 1987 and Senior Residency in 1990. Having an academic bend of mind, he decided to apply for FRCA and migrate to the West. But destiny had decreed otherwise.

Dr. Anita Jain: What brought you into private practice? Dr. Rajesh Dhall: Destiny.

I was born and raised in Delhi but had never been to East Delhi. One fine day I went to East Delhi, Vivek Vihar to be precise, to

collect some notes from a friend for my forthcoming FRCA exam. On the way, to my surprise, I found my friend and senior, Dr. Deepak Pande, standing in front of a beautiful building named Pushpanjali Medical Centre (PMC), looking rather pensive. After exchanging pleasantries he told me that there was an urgent need for an anesthesiologist in PMC and tried to persuade me to join. I refused because I had not thought of private practice but he argued that I needed a source of income. So very reluctantly I agreed but only for six months after which I would leave for the UK to take my PLAB exam. 33 years have passed and I am still here!

AJ: But what about your dream of settling in Europe?

RD: It fizzled out. I was very happy in PMC. The jump in income from the meagre salary of a senior Resident in those days to Rs. 30,000 in my first month of practice filled me with elation. Soon my elder son, Rishabh was born. When he was six months old I went to the UK and cleared PLAB on the first attempt but during those 15 days, I was so homesick and missed my son so much that I gave up the idea of FRCA. Instead I began to concentrate on private practice and joined two more hospitals – Sanjeevan Hospital in Darya Ganj and Sahi Hospital in Jangpura.

AJ: Didn't you find it difficult to commute?

RD: Not initially because I was living on MAMC campus and all attachments were equidistant from there. But, over time, all three hospitals became very busy and I had to choose one. I chose PMC and shifted my residence to East Delhi.

AJ: What made you choose PMC?

RD: There were many reasons of which the foremost was the robust support system provided by Dr. Vinay Aggarwal and his team of physicians. However dire the situation, I never felt alone. Dr Vinay or Dr. Gera would leave their work and stand by me till the patient was out of danger. Second was the infrastructure of the OT. At a time, when anesthesiologists were expected to bring their own portable anesthesia machines, PMC had a well-equipped OT complete with an anesthesia workstation and OT technician! Third was job satisfaction: Right from the beginning I got to work with the best surgeons like Dr. Jalali and Dr. R K Jain who performed very complicated surgeries including thoracotomies. It was almost like being in a medical college again. Soon Dr. Jhamb began to do laparoscopic surgery. We even held a live laparoscopy workshop at PMC as early as 1993 under the leadership of Dr. Sharda Jain. Another feature, which is perhaps unique to PMC, was the bonding between consultants right from the start, with Dr. Vinay assuming the role of the head of the family. The monthly Pushpanjali kitty brought our children together and added to the sense of belonging.

AJ: Being an anesthesiologist, you must have faced many challenging situations. Can you narrate a few?

RD: The list is unending but let me try. In 1997, a patient who was the sister of a senior gynecologist and had undergone hysterectomy, collapsed in the bathroom on the second post-op day. There was no lift in PMC at that time so we carried her up the stairs to the ICU in our arms, and put her on a ventilator. All our physicians rushed to help; a diagnosis of massive pulmonary embolism was made and streptokinase was given. We were able to save her only because of the amazing teamwork at PMC. In another instance, I had to do Autologous Blood Transfusion. In 2004 a man was brought to our ER, bleeding profusely from multiple stab wounds on his thorax and abdomen. He was in hypovolemic shock and needed blood urgently but AB negative blood was not available. He was not in a condition to be shifted to a tertiary care centre so, after resuscitation, as a life-saving measure, Dr. Jhamb and Dr. C.M. Goel operated upon him in the PMC OT while I transfused him with the blood oozing from his massive hemothorax using a chest tube as a last-ditch effort. He also survived.

AJ: I think you have enjoyed your time in PMC. Tell me something which you don't like about PMC.

RD: I miss the introspection meetings which we used to have in past years.

AJ: What would you suggest for the future?

RD: PMC has come a long way already. Dr Vinay is very progressive so PMC has progressed. But I would be pleased if we could resume our introspection meetings. Also, our ICU needs new equipment like Central nursing stations and monitors.

AJ: Have you ever regretted leaving academia?

RD: I have not left academia. Though I spend most of my time in PMC, I am also a recognized Postgraduate Teacher and Academic head at another Hospital where I am a Supervisor and Guide for DNB Anesthesiology. Fifteen students have already cleared DNB Anesthesia under my guidance.

AJ: Amazing! After all this, I wonder if you have any hobbies.

RD: I am passionate about music and an ardent admirer of Mohd. Rafi. Every year, on 31st July, I make time to attend his anniversary celebrations, organized by the Rafi Foundation, at Siri Fort Auditorium.

AJ: How would you describe yourself in one line?

RD: Very sincere and affectionate with a family-first ideology.

AJ: Thank you, Sir, for giving me so much time. Dr Dhall's wife, Mrs. Anjana Dhall, is the current Principal, College of Nursing, GTB Hospital, DU. She is also the President of the Delhi Nursing Council. They have two sons, both of whom are in management positions. The elder one, Rishabh is with Flipcart in Bangalore after doing MBA from IIM Ahmedabad. He has recently got married. The younger one, Shivam completed MBA from IIM Kozhikode and is now with Axis Bank in Mumbai. We wish the whole family much happiness, health and success.




